It was determined that this truck has the salt spreader on it and should be repaired. The green truck is too light to plow, would like to retire that truck for plowing and use the plow package off the green truck and put on the new truck. It was decided to try to keep the camouflage running for another year especially for the salt spreader. Mr. Bauer informed Pete Welch that the custodians need to clean out the old jail for a tour that is going to be held there on November 30, 2008.
