#### Administrator/Clerk's Report

Cheryl Nolan stated that an email was received from Humane Society in regards to kennels, requesting time with the board to offer some ideas in this respect to save money. Ms. Nolan was instructed to reply that the dog warden is on the agenda to discuss the kennels at the May 27, 2008 board meeting at 10:30 a.m.

At 9:15 a.m. Sharon Lockwood and Tom Gerrity, David Kniffin, Board of Elections came before the board in regards to the ADA signage in regards to polling places. Mr. Kniffin stated that they have received a very detailed letter from the Secretary of State in this regard which they are going to enforce. It was stated that the state has already completed a spot check in regards to one of Huron County's polling which was found not in compliance. Mr. Kniffin stated that the ORC states that any citizen with a disability should be able to go into a polling place regardless of their disability, be able to get into it, receive instructions, and vote themselves without assistance in any polling place that the county has available and that is statewide. So all the grumbling that we hear and some of the discussion that we have heard that we have a very good solution the law says without assistance. The Secretary of State says that it will be done. So they took a survey to determine what the situation is, but the rock and the hard place is

that a lot of folks in the rural areas do not see this as a big problem, because they just think there are ways to vote and this thing about going to a polling place and be able to vote unassisted is over the top. However, where they are in between a rock and a hard place is that this is not the county's rule, but the are going to have to sign an affidavit and they are going to have to make a decision on polling places probably 60 days before the elections because if they need to change a location this have to be done at least 30 days prior to the election which is law, so they can't wait until the last minute to make this decision. The problem is that throughout the county people love to vote in their townhall in a location central in the precinct so we understand that is a big issue, but on the other hand they hear that these changes are not going to be made to be ADA compliant we have already done improvements and here is another unfunded mandate. Mr. Kniffin stated that it seems like it is us telling them what to do, we are not going to tell them what to do. We are going to tell them that we can not have the polling place there in November if we are not compliant but we are not going to tell them what they have to do with their polling place. It is not within their right to do so, but they do have to have a polling place that is compliant. The board of elections and the staff thought that maybe the Board of Commissioner, Board of Elections, and Township Trustees meet at one of the commissioners meetings and talk about this situation. This has been done in other counties and the problem was resolved. Mr. Kniffin stated that he wanted to board to know what the approach is going to be to each of these townships, they have completed the survey, and they are not here to say that they are forcing them to do anything, but just letting them know that they can't have the polling location here if they are not compliant, show them what the affidavit is and ask them to work with them. At this point Mr. Kniffin informed the board that there is also going to be an August special election, for Bellevue city schools. Mr. Bauer stated that he has attended 14 of the 19 townships meeting and they are not blaming the board of elections from what he has heard at these meetings. Mr. Bauer stated that all understand that the board of elections is just the messenger, and stated that those that just need signs are going to do it, but feel that it is stupid, but those that need restrooms are not going to do it because they just don't have the funds to do so. Mr. Bauer asked what would happen is eight or ten locations were to say we are not going to have it? Mr. Kniffin stated that is a big problem, because voters are confused which is not a good situation, and a lot of people will be frustrated and the board of elections will have extra expense notifying a lot of people that there will be new sites. So it is cost, frustration and this is the rock and a hard place that we are talking about. No one felt that the signage is a problem to become compliant but the restrooms at some of the township buildings is a problem because of funding for such improvements. Tom Gerrity stated that the ORC requires public facilities to allow the board of elections to use their locations and all the board has to do is inform them that they are requesting to use their facility and they have to provide this use at no costs except for janitorial fees. If public facility states they are not going to do that, they don't have a choice. Mr. Bauer stated but they don't have to upgrade for you, Mr. Gerrity stated that is the difficult thing, does not feel that it is within the board of elections right to tell them that they have to do certain things to become compliant. Mr. Kniffin stated that a legal opinion may be needed to make them become ADA compliant, but would they want to go to the trouble of forcing them to do something like that, doesn't feel that it makes any sense. No one felt that it makes good sense to force the townships to abide, but they have to understand that they can not be a polling place unless they do abide. Mr. Gerrity referred to letter that is going to come to the commissioners, because they don't want to be referred to the neighbor bully with the stick that says you have to do this, what they are going to provide some documents that states that the county engineer has most of these signs that they need for the public locations, and will do a one on one meeting with them instead of just sending the letter. Mike Adelman stated that basically the only problem at the Administration building is the signs. Mr. Kniffin stated that was correct and that they needed some help with the political issues as well. Stated that they all have contacts and that the board of elections would like to keep the polling places where they are at currently so that they don't have turmoil for the November elections. Mr. Bauer stated that he does not feel that one township will be able to make the restroom changes. Mr. Kniffin also discussed the communication issues and the fact that cell phones not working. During the snow storm it was brought to like that communication is critical. Letters will be sent out within the week to the polling places. Mr. Adelman asked if there are problems did they want to then ask the townships to come in to a commissioners' meeting for discussion. Mr. Kniffin stated that perhaps that could be done. The board agreed to fix the signs at the Administration Building to bring it in compliance.
