At 10:40 a.m. regular session resumed with the Elected Officials and Department heads meeting held in meeting room "D". Nineteen elected officials and department heads were in attendance. Mr. Adelman reviewed the agenda and introduced Sue Bommer, Human Resource Director who in turn introduced the invited speaker, Tally Gallogly, Employee Assistance Program Manager, from Summit Employee Assistance Program, helping employees achieve their peak potential. Revenue & budget updates Auditor spoke in regards to the departments submitting a list of retirees for the coming year and would like this list in the next month. Discussed fiscal review and will be looking at next year's budget. Mr. Tkach stated that at this time it looks as though cuts are going to have to come. Gary Ebinger, Weights & Measurer spoke to the accuracy of the gas pumps.

Discussion was had in regards to the CDBG FY 08 funds. The board discussed the list of projects submitted for funding from Ripley Township, Greenwich Township and Wakeman village. Both Ripley and Greenwich Township's applications qualified for funding, Wakeman village did not qualify as the LMI did not qualify. Mr. Kenny has stated that he would work with Wakeman village for the next round. The board reviewed Ripley and Greenwich projects along with a county project for the ADA restroom renovation at the courthouse. After discussion the board decided to fund the courthouse ADA restroom project in the estimated amount of \$75,000, and contingency due to nature of renovation work for a total of \$81,000 CDBG funds.

Ralph A. Fegley moved to approve the county courthouse ADA restroom project at an estimated cost of \$75,000 plus contingency for a total of \$81,000 CDBG formula 08 funds project. Gary W. Bauer seconded the motion.

Discussion: Mr. Adelman stated that both Ripley and Greenwich townships had submitted qualifying projects but after discussion the board decided to fund a county project that would benefit the entire county with the CDBG FY -08 formula funds, as the board has supported township projects the last few years. The roll being called upon it adoption, the vote resulted as follows:
