OTHER BUSINESS

Gary Bauer discussed Tom Jarrett amendment to his contract that Daivia Kasper, Assistant Prosecutor is working on at this time. Ms Kasper asked if the board had planned to charge Mr. Jarrett for the use of the basement. Mr. Bauer stated that the original agreement was not to charge for this area and that he could use it as long as he didn't use it for public use.

Mr. Bauer referred to the Board of Elections request for funding for a new server in the amount of \$3,999.000, and stated looking at this we have no money but we just keep spending. Mr. Silcox stated that the original email that was sent to the board of elections stated that they needed to replace the server or it could be put on a computer with XP it would just run slower at high volume times. Mr. Silcox stated that he does not see a need to purchase a new server when they can put it on a computer with XP and will not support spending the money on a new server at this time. Especially when we have to spend an extra \$25,000 to pay for the licenses for the voting machines. Mike Adelman stated that like he said at the beginning that he felt it was a needed computer server that was going to tie into the Secretary of State's office and they were being requested to do that, and that he did not have a problem in that respect to make sure we were in tune with the Secretary of State's office for voter registration to make sure everything was handled property. Mr. Adelman also stated though if there was am alternative method to accomplish that then that would be ok as well. Mr. Adelman stated that if it is a benefit to get this computer server to make sure that our board of elections is in a position to get this done right with the Secretary of State then he does not have a problem in getting that for them, and stated that he still believes the funds could come from permanent improvements, as other counties have used this fund for computer purchases. Mr. Bauer stated that he does not have a closed mind but has not had a conversation with Tom Gerrity yet and he will do that before making a decision. Mr. Adelman stated that if it would sufficiently with the XP computer he doesn't have a problem with that but if it does not then he doesn't think we should put the Board of Elections in a position where they are going to have some inadequate equipment to do the election process. Mr. Bauer stated that he would go to the Board of Elections and talk to them. Mr. Silcox stated that he has in his office the email that was sent to the Board of Elections which was not from the Secretary of

State's office, and when he talked with the Secretary of States office they new nothing about that request. Mr. Bauer stated that he would do some research and will revisit at a later date.

Mr. Adelman stated that on a related topic in term of the Board of Elections we received a paperwork where Josh Hahn, CCAO in regards to HB 260 which has a couple of provisions in which the CCAO does support and one of those is the up front payment for special elections, and also for the recovery of depreciation costs of voting equipment. There are a couple of items in HB 260 though that CCAO is not backing as well.

Mr. Bauer stated that he is moving toward getting a bid process put together for the Courthouse clock. Discussion was had in regards to the Courthouse Clock bidding process and Mr. Bauer thought that it might take six weeks and Mr. Silcox felt that was unrealistic. Mr. Silcox stated that the only reason he would say that in light of the time frame that this committee raised the funds and would like to see what the bottom line is that they need so he would like to see this move forward as soon as possible. Mr. Bauer stated that would like to make sure that it is done right and doesn't look for them to do this project during the winter months. Mr. Bauer and Ms. Kasper will discuss the specifications after the meeting.

Larry Silcox referred to the study that was done in 2005 about new phone equipment and the cost was substantial. Mr. Silcox stated that he talked with a gentleman yesterday and if the board would like to hear it would like to put a proposal together for service and not necessarily new equipment. There is a provider in Port Clinton that has several governmental agencies that they are providing the service for now and feels that we could be saving some money by doing that and going to one particular bill vs. billing every department. Mr. Silcox asked if this would be something that the board would be interested in to listening. Mr. Bauer stated that it can't hurt to listen.

At 10:00 a.m. Cary Brickner, Soil and Water Conservation District came before the board in regards to seek support for a resolution to the state general assembly to add some more funding before the amended budget is pass that would provide additional funding for Soil and Water Conservation District. Mr. Brickner stated that the original HB 1 that was passed by the Governor and House had a 1 to 1 match. The state for the last 60 years has been able to match local funding for Soil and Water Conservation District up to a 1 to 1 match. Mr. Brickner explained what has happened in the last few years in regards to this match. At this time the way the state budget stands right now it will only be 50% in the state's 2010 – 2011 budgets. What we are trying to do throughout the state is to gain support from county commissioners to ask the general assembly to come up with something more for the Soil and Water Districts. Mr. Brickner also discussed the amount of funding that comes into the county and what it is used for.

RESOLUTION TO GENERAL ASSEMBLY EXPRESSING NEED FOR IMMEDIATE FUNDING SUPPORT TO OHIO'S 88 COUNTY SOIL & WATER CONSERVATION DISTRICTS

WHEREAS, the Board of Huron County Commissioners recognize the economic challenges facing Huron County and the State of Ohio; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Huron County Commissioners seeks to increase economic growth and job development in Huron County and the State of Ohio;

WHEREAS, the Board of Huron County Commissioners recognizes that conservation programs are a critical component to the sustainability of economic development, food development, the environment, and our quality of life;

and

WHEREAS, the Board of Huron County Commissioners values the technical assistance, services and programs the Huron County SWCD provides to Huron County and the State of Ohio; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Huron County Commissioners recognizes that strong funding is necessary to enhance urban, suburban, and rural environmental quality; provide for productive soils and clean waters; forestry and wildlife management; improve public health; build sustainable economies and attractive communities; protect fertile farmland and important open spaces; create and maintain adequate recreational

opportunities and accompanying infrastructure;

and

WHEREAS, the Board of Huron County Commissioners believes the Huron County SWCD is a cost-effective and efficient intergovernmental partnership which leverages local, state and federal funding for the purpose keeping our county viable, and protecting a way of life;

and

WHEREAS, the Board of Huron County Commissioners financially supports the Huron County SWCD;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Huron County Commissioners supports and urges an immediate funding resolution be approved by the Ohio General Assembly that fully funds the state match appropriation so that Ohio's 88 County SWCDs can continue providing critical conservation programs and practices needed to keep Ohio's soils productive and waters clean, aiding our economy; and enhancing our environment for the quality of life for all Ohioans;

and further

BE IT RESOLVED that the Clerk to the Board of Huron County Commissioners forward this resolution and any other supporting documents to the Ohio General Assembly.

BE IT RESOLVED, that the foregoing resolution was adopted and all actions and deliberations of the Board of Commissioners of the County of Huron, Ohio, relating thereto were conducted in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all applicable legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Mike Adelman seconded the motion. The roll being called upon its adoption, the vote resulted as follows:

Mr. Silcox stated that the next thing on his list to discuss was the CEDS committee recommendations and asked if there were any additions to the list. Mr. Adelman stated that he would like to add two, there should be some representative from the village of Monroeville, and one from North Fairfield along with the Willard city schools superintendent, Dave Danoff.

Mr. Silcox also stated that they need to talk to Mr. Welch about the Transfer Station designation process needs to be discussed and we need to move forward on this and it is something that needs to be watched very closely and move forward before the end of the year. Mr. Silcox asked where we stand on the X-ray machine. Mr. Bauer stated that is in the hands of Linda Stower and Judge Conway to right the plan. Ms. Nolan stated that she has sent the registration form out to the sheriff for his signature and has not received it back yet to send to the Ohio Department of Health along with the registration fee. Once again Ms. Nolan stated that the machine needs to be registered before using.

Mr. Adelman stated that there is going to be a conference call for the Natural Gas Committee on next Tuesday, November 24, 2009 at 10:00 a.m. Mr. Adelman stated that we have all received the latest in the sales tax numbers and as the trend continues we can see it again that it is down. The number for the month of November 2009 this year \$601,518,.00 which compares to \$650,240.00 from last year and you can see a difference of about \$49,000.00 which brings us to a total on the year of being down about \$569,000.00 from 2008 collections. As far as where we are at with the estimate if we were still on the old estimate we would only be at 90% of that estimate, but with the revised estimate it puts us at 93.5%. Mr. Adelman also referred to a notation in regards to what impact auto sales has had and with this month's collection it was 25% comes from auto sales and in reference to that the total amount of 2008 was 23%. At this time the cash for clunkers has not made that big of an impact but has kept it steady. Discussion was had as to how the sales tax is released from the Auditor.

At 10:30 a.m. Pete Welch, Solid Waste Management District Coordinator came before the board along with Jack Meyers, Erie County Sanitarian to speak in regards to a letter that had been sent to the board with an offer to take trash. Mr. Meyers that they are struggling at the Erie County Landfill and that they are looking for additional revenue. Mr. Meyers stated that they wanted to bid but didn't know quite how to do that as being a government entity. Mr. Meyers stated that he did come to the bid opening and found out what the bids were and talked with the Erie County Commissioners and did a budget forecast with \$28.00 per ton for five years with 35,000 tons per year of waste from the Huron County Transfer Station and this

did balance their budget. Mr. Meyers stated but since he sent the letter with this information Pete Welch has stated that you are looking at a three year contract not a five year contract and so he went back to the Erie County Commissioners and talked about this with them and verbally they have authorized him to offer \$26.70 per ton for three years and the fourth and fifth year it would be offered at \$28.00 per ton. At that price we would want to enter into an intergovernmental agreement with Huron County and they would hire a trucking firm to haul the waste from the Huron County Transfer Station to the Erie County Landfill. They would have to do this with competitive bidding and to set this rate of \$26.70 per ton for three years for Huron County they would have to hold three public hearings to do so. They have a resolution going to the Erie County Commissioners to discuss setting these hearings and these hearing will be done by December 17, 2009 and that will be the date of the third public hearing and then they will set the rates on December 17, 2009 to be able to officially make this offer. Mr. Meyer stated they would love to be able to start this January 1, 2010 but it would depend on the bidding of the trucking companies. The trucking company may push this date back and it might be more like March 1, 2010. Mr. Meyers stated that this is pretty much their offer and will put it in writing if it is acceptable to the board. Further discussion was had and Commissioner Patrick Shenigo also attended this session for discussion along with discussion in regards to cooperation between the counties and the NASA runway.

At 10:48 a.m. Larry J. Silcox moved to enter into Executive Session ORC 121.22 (G) (3) a conference with an attorney for the public body concerning disputes involving the public body that are the subject of pending or imminent court action. Mike Adelman seconded the motion. The roll being called upon its adoption, the vote resulted as follows:

At 11:20 Larry J. Silcox moved to end executive session ORC 121.22 (G) (3). Mike Adelman seconded the motion. The roll being called upon its adoption, the vote resulted as follows:

At 11:20 a.m. the board recessed.

At 11:29 a.m. regular session resumed.

Mike Adelman referred to some changes that were made on the budget worksheet. Mr. Adelman stated that this worksheet reflects a slight adjustment that we had to add \$1,100 to fund #030 Health and Vital Statistic line which was changed to \$107,156 and this \$1,100 came off the #041 Contingency fund. That was the only change on that sheet. Mr. Adelman also stated that we are at a point where we need to get some budget worksheets out to departments. Mr. Adelman also discussed the Human Service bonds which are not the responsibility of the general fund to pay the majority of these bonds through 2020 and the reason for this is because the Federal Government will no longer reimburse that full bond payment as they had in the past. The bond amount is \$4,215,000 divided by the useful life of the building which was determined to be 40 years so the amount that will be paid by Department of Job & Family Services will be \$105,375.00 per year. The bond payment however is \$327,412.500 and we have bond payment through 2020. The bond payment that needs to be paid by the general fund will be \$232,037.00. Mr. Adelman stated that the way we should be able to handle it for 2010 and this won't be able to happen until we get the interim budget passed and we see what the carryover will be when we get into January. In fund #031 there will be \$104,292.00 that will be left that Department of Job & Family Services will not use which the balance that is in there now and there will \$111,000.00 in the transfer out #099 fund which was accumulated because we did the increase in the gate fee at the landfill and that is the amount that we didn't have to pay out for the landfill bonds. This gives us \$215,292.00 which means that somewhere out of this budget we still need to come up with \$16,745.00 to make that bond payment. Mr. Bauer stated that he would not vote for the VOCA grant match. We do not have the money and we can not spend it which is another \$52,744.00. Mr. Adelman stated that this does put that match in jeopardy. Mr. Adelman stated that Judge Conway and Judge Cardwell had made some indication that if there was some help needed to fund this match that they may be able to help out. Mr. Adelman stated that he would like to talk with them and see what they might have. Mr. Bauer stated that he will not vote for it to come out of the general fund budget. Mr. Adelman stated that he will still be talking with DJFS director to see if they can't help out

with additional funding in the next couple of years. Mr. Bauer stated that he did not feel comfortable with zeroing out the Airport fund and would like to add \$5,000 to the airport fund. Mr. Adelman stated that he has thought about this as well. Mr. Adelman stated even though they do not have to fund that are we coming across that we are saying that there isn't any value to it. Mr. Adelman stated that putting \$4,000 to \$5,000 at this time which could change down the road and we could decide that we can't do it at that time. Mr. Bauer stated that one of his thoughts in this regard is that Dennis Sokal is already working with meeting with the Baders and trying to work out a schedule for next year and we have fought that piece for so long and now the president of the airport board is trying to be ahead of the game and trying to do something, and what is good for raceway park is good for Huron County. Mr. Bauer stated that in the final budget he has still not given up helping agriculture as well. Mr. Adelman stated that with all this being said are we ready to get some worksheets out there to the departments. Mr. Silcox stated that the prosecutor had suggested that they take all the elected officials salaries out of their appropriations for now and see if they would balance. The board disagreed with this and decided that they can not do this. Mr. Bauer asked Mr. Silcox if he would survive if the \$5,000 is put back into the budget. Mr. Silcox stated that he would not vote for it. Mr. Silcox stated that he understands what both of them are saying but stated that at some point in time when we are looking at the cuts that we are looking at unless someone is willing to free up some special funds and there are a couple out there with a considerable amount of money in them he is not willing to put money into the airport that we do not have. Mr. Silcox stated that he is still looking at numbers of what each office had in regards to employees in 2005 and what they have today.

At 11:49 a.m. Larry J. Silcox moved to adjourn. Mike Adelman seconded the motion. The meeting stood adjourned.
