Ms. Nolan stated that the purpose of the hearing was to hear testimony for and or against the increase of the conveyance fee/real property transfer tax from \$.20 to \$.30 per one hundred dollars. In attendance were: James Wiedenheft, Huron County Development Council; Craig Fitch, Huron County Development Council; Deb Angell, OSU Extension; Shawn Tappel, Huron County Development Council; Jerry Shoemaker, Huron County Development Council; Bethany Dentler, Norwalk Development Council; Dave Gulden, Norwalk Development Council; Melissa James, Norwalk Huron County Chamber of Commerce; Ben Kenny, WSOS; Sue Lesch, Mayor Norwalk City; Kathy Phillips, OSU Extension; Bonnie Malone, OSU Extension. Mr. Fegley called once for testimony in favor of increasing the proposed conveyance fee/real property transfer tax from \$.20 to \$.30 per \$100.00. Jim Wiedenheft spoke in favor of the increase and explained how these funds will be used and how it will benefit the entire county. Mr. Fegley called the twice for testimony in favor, the president of HCDC spoke in favor of this increase and thanked the board of commissioners for considering this increase and stated that HCDC has always run on a shoestring budget trying to make ends meet. Explained the programs of Ottawa County and how they have been able to land many new businesses, feels that marketing is very important. Mr. Fegley called thrice for testimony in favor of the increase, Melissa James, Norwalk Huron County Chamber of Commerce spoke in regards how it would help the marketing process for tourism as well. Ben Kenny, WSOS also spoke as a Huron County resident and talked about the Ottawa County programs as well. Betheny Dentler Norwalk Economic Development also spoke in favor of the increase. Along with Mayor Sue Lesch spoke in favor as well and stated that the county would reap the benefits and the board should do an over site as to how the dollars are spent. thoughts and prayers during this difficult time.

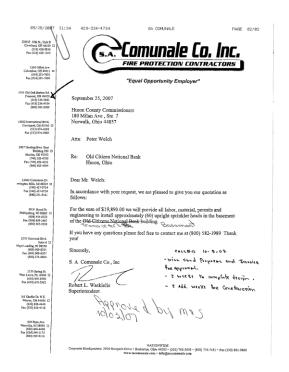

OTHER BUSINESS

Gary Bauer discussed a conversation with Cary Brickner, Soil & Water Conservation District in regards to funds for drainage. Mr. Brickner will come before the board in this regard at a later date. Mr. Bauer also discussed the meeting he attended with the Erie County planners and stated that not much has been changed in this regard and feels this will be a while before this happens. Mr. Bauer also discussed his trip with Erie Basin to Malabar Farms. Stated that it was a very worthwhile trip and very informative.

At 10:00 a.m. Roland Tkach, Auditor came before the board in regards to a purchase agreement between the General Health District and the owner of a building on Executive Drive that the Health District will purchase if their levy passes in November. Mr. Tkach stated that he has had realtors contacting him in regards to signing the purchase agreement. Mr. Hollinger, General Health District stated that this is just a good faith agreement in the case that the levy passed, and if the levy would pass then it was saying that we would be buying the facility, and if it failed then each party would go their own way. Daivia Kasper, Assistant Prosecutor stated that the agreement was in a draft form, there was a draft done in May and a draft done in June, and at the time the drafts went out we still had not determined how the property was being financed. So on the draft the General Health District is the buyer, and a discussion was had during a commissioners' meeting that the Health District had already approached a bank to take out a loan and the Board of Commissioners had discussed going out to their small loan fund and at that meeting the thought was that the commissioners were interested in that and that they would look into that. The purchase agreement was never revised to indicate that the commissioners were going to purchase the property. Ms. Kasper stated that if the commissioners did take that loan out then they would be the buyer and there would be an agreement where the general health district would pay the county back similar to the way that Soil and Water had done, and these pieces were still pending. Ms. Kasper stated that she had anticipated that a purchase agreement would be signed prior to the election, because the purchase agreement states that if the election does not approve the levy then everyone walks away, and if the election does approve the levy then everything continues. Once the purchase agreement was signed then \$10,000.00 was to be turned over to the seller, but that money is returned if the levy fails. Ms. Kasper stated also that she understood that the commissioners were talking about an appraisal for the property, that the property would be valued at the \$1.1 million. Mr. Hollinger stated that they had checked on an appraiser and stated that the cost quote is \$2,500.00, and that his board felt that was excessive so he checked with another agency that does commercial property which was also in that same range. The General Health District did not feel that was prudent use of taxpayers' money, and this was their decision. Mr. Fegley stated but the Commissioners had made a request that they do so. Further discussion was had in this regard. The board agreed that an appraisal should be done and it would be investigated further by Ms. Kasper as to whether or not the Health Board could purchase the property by taking out a loan. Ms. Kasper will get back to the board with this information.

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Directors of the Huron County Solid Waste Management District of Huron County, Ohio that the foregoing recitals are adopted as if fully set forth herein, and that:
